2018 Island Sailing Club Scholarship

We are pleased to announce that we are now accepting applications for the 2018 Island Sailing Club (ISC) Scholarship. The ISC Scholarship is a one-year membership to Island Sailing Club provided by ISC and OWSA. Each year, four OWSA members are awarded the scholarship, and share a club membership. Each scholarship recipient receives a Learn to Sail Class through ISC. After passing the class, recipients will have access to boats 20' to 23'. The ISC scholarship gives OWSA members the opportunity to build sailing skills and confidence as a skipper. ISC members experience the decision-making process of planning outings, gathering crew, and choosing activities and/or destinations. ISC takes care of boat maintenance. Just make a reservation.

Recipients agree to a two-year commitment for this program. The first year, recipients enjoy the membership. The second year, recipients serve as mentors, and assist new recipients. Recipients are required to Skipper an ISC boat as their skill level permits and take out other OWSA members for Wednesday Night Sail. Additional OWSA activities include going out as a First Mate one time a month on WNS. There may be times that the demand for a First Mate is greater than the need for an additional boat. In this case, the expectation would be to go out as a First Mate.

Other things to consider when applying:

- 1. In April or May, recipients will take and pass an ISC-taught Learn to Sail class (class is free and included in the scholarship). Challenging the Learn to Sail course will not be an option.
- 2. After passing the class, recipients will have access to boats 20' to 23' in 3 locations.
- 3. If a scholarship recipient already has their Basic Keelboat 101 certification at the time of award, she immediately has access to 20' to 23' boats, and has the option of purchasing one next level class at a 10% discount.
- 4. Recipients will need to learn how to start and trouble shoot outboard engines.
- 5. Recipients will share skippering an ISC boat weekly and participate in OWSA sailing events, such as Wednesday Night Sail (WNS) or First Mate on WNS (on non-ISC boat), whichever is needed more.
- 6. ISC Scholarship awardees need to be certified as a First Mate by June.
- 7. Each recipient is responsible for any damage that they incur on an ISC boat, up to \$1,500. (This may be covered on your homeowners or renters insurance policy please check). Recipients are also liable for damage to a third party vessel.

The ISC scholarship provides the means for hands-on learning and is another opportunity for OWSA members to sail. Additionally, the OWSA Board views the scholarship as a way to recognize members who support OWSA through volunteering and involvement in OWSA activities. To be considered, you must have joined OWSA prior to March 31st, 2017. Preference will be given those with a history of volunteering. Scholarship applications are

rated by past participants on how thoroughly the questions on the application are answered and the applicant's willingness to give back to the club through past and future volunteering. Raters are also looking for how applicants will use the scholarship experience creatively to give back to OWSA and our members. A successful applicant typically has given some time as a volunteer, has completely answered all questions on the application (usually about 2-4 pages), and has come up with some good ideas on how to use the scholarship for our members' benefit.
