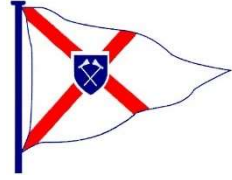

NOTICE OF RACE INSHORE 2018



Organising Authority: St Helier Yacht Club

This Notice of Race (NoR) consists of two main sections. Part 1 applies to all St Helier Yacht Club (SHYC) organised races and includes rules that affect every race unless modified by Part 2, which details rules that apply to specific series or races. When a rule is modified in Part 2, it takes precedence over the rule in Part 1. Races organised in association with SHYC will have their own NoR.

PART 1

1.1 RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1.1.1 The series will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020*.
- 1.1.2 The prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association shall apply. No other National Authority prescriptions shall apply.
- 1.1.3 The Class rules and regulations of appropriate One-Design and/or Class rules, IRC Rules Parts A, B & C shall apply, except as varied below or in the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.1.4 This Notice of Race and any amendments thereto. Amendments to the Notice of Race will be published on the SHYC Noticeboard and the SHYC website.
- 1.1.5 Sailing Instructions will be published after the Closing Date on the SHYC Noticeboard and the SHYC website.

1.2 ADVERTISING

- 1.2.1 Competitor advertising must be in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.
- 1.2.2 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

1.3 RESPONSIBILITY

- 1.3.1 Yacht racing can be dangerous. The attention of Persons in Charge is drawn to RRS Fundamental Rule 4: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone" and to World Sailing Offshore Special Regulations 1.02.1 which begins: "The safety of a yacht and her crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the Person in Charge..." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - a) they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
 - b) they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
 - c) they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission;
 - d) their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
 - e) the provision of a race management team and other officials and volunteers by the

event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
f) they are responsible for ensuring that their boat is equipped and seaworthy so as to face extremes of weather; that there is a crew sufficient in number, experience and fitness to withstand such weather; and that the safety equipment is properly maintained, stowed, in date and familiar to the crew.

- 1.3.2 The SHYC, its sponsors, and other organising clubs accept no responsibility or liability for loss of life or injury to members or others, or for the loss of, or damage to, any vessel or property.
- 1.3.3 The Race Committee will make starting signals unless in their opinion it is manifestly unsafe for any of the boats entered to remain in the vicinity of the starting line. Each boat shall exercise her responsibility under RRS Fundamental Rule 4 and decide whether or not to start or to continue to race.
- 1.3.4 No boat will be accepted as an entry unless the Person in Charge has, before the start of the race, signed a declaration in the terms set out in NoR 1.11.
- 1.3.5 Competitors attention is drawn to RRS 1.2 life-saving equipment: "Each competitor is individually responsible for wearing a personal flotation device adequate for the conditions". However for *Races in the Offshore Series* a combined lifejacket and harness should be worn on deck:
- Between the hours of sunset and sunrise
 - When alone on deck
 - When reefed
 - When true wind speed is 25 knots or more
 - When the visibility is less than 1 nautical mile

1.4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 1.4.1 SHYC races are open to boats in possession of a valid IRC rating certificate/class certificate(s) to race IRC and will be allocated an event handicap if not racing IRC. (References: <http://ircrating.org/>)
- 1.4.2 IRC rated boats shall hold a valid IRC rating certificate that does not have to be endorsed as at the Rating Deadline and ensure SHYC is in possession of a copy of that certificate. Changes to ratings and class certificates will only be accepted after the Rating Deadline in exceptional circumstances at the discretion of SHYC. Every boat racing shall have on board a current valid signed copy of the rating.
- 1.4.3 IRC Rule 22.4.2 is deleted and replaced by "The maximum number of crew that may sail aboard a yacht shall be the number shown on the certificate. There is no weight limit.
- 1.4.4 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and delivering it to St Helier Yacht Club by the Closing Date.
- 1.4.5 Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 1.4.6 The following restrictions on the number of boats apply:
- There shall be a minimum of 2 entries in each Class to constitute a valid series for that Class.
 - A sole race competitor may start a race and optionally sail the course to qualify for appropriate series points.
- 1.4.7 Competitors will be informed on the St. Helier Yacht Club Notice Board after the Closing Date in which Class they will be racing.

1.5 CLASSES AND CLASS FLAGS

- 1.5.1 Class 0 parameter requirements include: DLR Less than 150, LH less than 10m and TCC greater than 0.950.
- 1.5.2 Class 4 parameter requirements include: IRC Cruiser with an IRC Hull Factor of 7.6 or less and a minimum DLR of 200.
- 1.5.3 Yachts can elect to sail single or 2 handed and in doing so the use of an autopilot will be permitted.
- 1.5.4 SHYC reserves the right to amend the class bands in the light of 2018 data before the start of the season.

1.6 COURSES

- 1.6.1 Courses will be outlined in Part 2 and detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

The Race Committee may set different courses for different *Classes*. In this instance the results in an IRC overall will be calculated on corrected average speed. This changes RRS A3.

1.7 PENALTIES

- 1.7.1 Taking a penalty (RRS44), unless changed by the Sailing Instructions, the penalty for breaking a rule of RRS Part 2 shall be a Two Turns Penalty as permitted and described in RRS 44.2.
- 1.7.2 Penalties for infringements of other rules will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

1.8 COMMUNICATION

- 1.8.1 A boat may, without infringing RRS 41, request and receive repetition of information broadcast by the Race Committee, or be told whether or not a broadcast has been made.
- 1.8.2 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

1.9 SCORING

- 1.9.1 The Low Point System of scoring as described in Appendix A will be used. Discards are described in Part 2.
- 1.9.2 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 1.9.3 The final sentence in RRS A3 – Scoring is modified to read “However, when a handicap or rating system is used a boat’s corrected time, rounded to the nearest second, shall determine her finishing place”. When IRC Classes sail different courses the IRC Overall result will be determined by Corrected Average Speed. Corrected Average Speed will be calculated using Course Distance (as determined by the Race Committee) divided by a boat’s corrected time.

1.10 RACE PRIZES AND TROPHIES

- 1.10.1 The trophies to be awarded for a race are outlined in Part 2.

1.11 RACE ENTRY DECLARATION

- 1.11.1 The Person in Charge for each race shall agree to the terms of the declaration on the entry form below submit a completed signed copy to SHYC before the Closing Date.

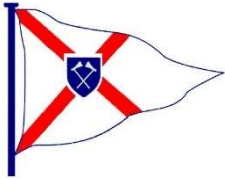
1.12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the series.

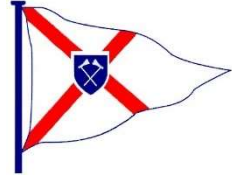
1.13 INSURANCE

- 1.13.1 Boats shall be adequately and suitably insured before racing and have in force a valid third party liability insurance cover, including racing, to a minimum of £3,000,000.
