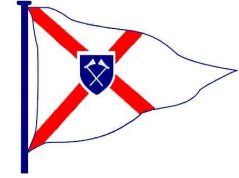


ST HELIER YACHT CLUB 2018 DAYBOAT EVENING SERIES

NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The series will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association shall apply.

2 ADVERTISING

Competitor advertising must be in accordance with World Sailing Regulations.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The series is open to all Dayboats (including small traditional open boats) in possession of a valid 2018 Jersey Dayboat Rating, issued by the Island Handicap Committee.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and delivering it to St Helier Yacht Club by 1800 hrs on Monday 14th May.
- 3.4 Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 3.5 The following restrictions on the number of boats apply:
 - 3.5.1 There shall be a minimum of 2 boats entering to constitute a valid series.

4 SCHEDULE

The series is to consist of the 6 race evenings. Each evening will comprise one race.

The length of races will be determined by the starter who may consult with one or more of the participating skippers and will depend on the conditions and time available. Indicative timings are provided below.

Class	Target time – 1 st boats finish	Target race time limit	First mark time limit
Dayboat	60 minutes	90 minutes	30 minutes

If no boat has passed the first mark by the “First Mark time Limit” the race may be abandoned.

5 MEASUREMENTS

All competing boats shall ensure that they are in possession of a valid 2018 Jersey Dayboat Rating, issued by the Island Handicap Committee. Application. Where a boat held a valid 2017 Jersey Dayboat Rating this will be applied for 2018 unless changes have been made to the relevant measurements for the boat. 6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available from the Organising Authority prior to the entry deadline.

7 THE COURSES

The courses will be set in St. Aubin’s Bay using the following fixed marks shown in the St. Aubin’s Bay Course Card.

- 3 - St Aubin’s Fort Race mark
- 4 - Beach
- 5 - Le Vrachiere

The course card is available to download from www.shyc.je/Racing/Race-Administration/.

8 SCORING

8.1 The Low Point System of scoring as described in Appendix A to The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020, will apply.

8.2 At least two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

8.3 When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores.

8.4 When five races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

8.5 When six races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

9 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

10 PRIZES

10.1 The winning boat overall will win the Jolly Boat Open Challenge Cup which will be awarded at the annual prizegiving ceremony.

10.2 Place prizes will be awarded at St Helier Yacht Club following the end of racing on the 6th race evening or on a date that will be announced if racing is cancelled on that evening.

11 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

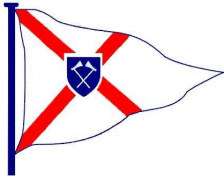

12 INSURANCE

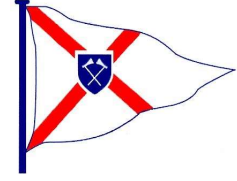
Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.
