NOTICE OF RACE

RS 200 Youth (U22 Championships) 2021

Saturday 4th and Sunday 5th September 2021

1. RULES

- 1.1** The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2** The Itchenor Sailing Club (ISC) sailing instructions will apply and are available on the Club's website (www.itchenorsc.co.uk) and from the Club office on the day of the event.
- 1.3** The ISC Sailing Instructions may be subject to amendments for the event. Any amendments will be placed on the Club's website prior to the event and will also be available on the day.
- 1.4** The time limit in ISC sailing instruction 14.1 is amended to 1.5 hours.
- 1.5** The Exoneration Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available. These procedures can be obtained from the ISC Office and the RYA web site.

2. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The organising authority is Itchenor Sailing Club.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1** The event is open to all boats of the RS 200 class 24 and under.
- 3.2** Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form and submitting it, together with the required fee, by Friday 3th September 2021 Youth (22 or under Championships) <https://www.itchenorsc.co.uk/booking/type/open-events>
- 3.3** To qualify for the prize of the RS200 Youth Champions both Helm and Crew must be aged 22 or under at the start of the event
- 3.4** To qualify for the prize of the RS200 Junior Champions both Helm and Crew must be aged 18 or under at the start of the event
- 3.5** ISC Members aged 23-25 may enter the event but only qualify for the ISC Club Burgee
- 3.5 Parent/Guardian Declarations:**

All sailors who are under 18 years of age must submit consent and supervision forms signed by their parent or legal guardian. The form may be filled out here: http://www.itchenorsc.co.uk/_html/parental_consent.html

4. FEES

- 4.1** The entry fee is £50 per boat for those entering before the 29th August. After which the entry fee is £60.00 per boat
- 4.2** For boats visiting Chichester Harbour who have not already paid Harbour Dues, there is a £2.00 charge payable on top of the race fees. This is included in the 2-day entry fee.

5. REGISTRATION and SCHEDULE

- 5.1** Registration will take place from 08.30 hrs Saturday 4th September at ISC.
- 5.2** If available, boats must display event advertising supplied at Registration in the manner and position advised at Registration.
- 5.3 Dates of Racing and Programme:**

This schedule of races will depend on weather conditions. The Race Committee aims to run 8 in total taking into account anticipated weather conditions. It is expected that up to 4 races will be held back-to-back each day.

- 5.4** There will be a briefing for competitors in the vicinity of the Bandstand at 09:15am on the 4th September and 10am on the 5th September

6. VENUE

- 6.1** The location of the event is Itchenor Sailing Club, Chichester Harbour, West Sussex PO20 7AG.
- 6.2** The racing area will be in Chichester Harbour.

7. SCORING

- 7.1** The Low Point System of Appendix A of the RRS will apply.
- 7.2** Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 7.3**
- When fewer than 4 races are completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores, with no discard.
 - When 4 or more are completed, there will be one discard.
 - When 6 or more are completed, there will be two discards.
 - When 8 or more are completed, there will be three discards.

8. PRIZES

- 8.1** Prizes will be awarded at the Club's discretion.

8.2 Prize giving will take place on the Club lawn as soon as possible after racing is completed.

8.3 RS200 Youth Champions – 1st Helm and Crew 22 or under

8.4 RS200 Junior Champions – 1st Helm and Crew 18 or under

8.5 ISC Club Burgee – 1st ISC Helm and Crew under 25

9. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RISK AND RISK STATEMENT

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.”

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, support boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of support boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- g) It is their responsibility to familiarize themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event;

10. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of not less than £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

INFORMATION FOR COMPETITORS

1. BERTHING AND TRAILERS

1.1 Boats shall be kept in their assigned area on the ISC landing stage.

1.2 Please note that the staging could get wet at high water so all gear and valuables should be left secure. Boats staying on the stage overnight should be tied down.

1.3 Trailers must be manhandled from the road to the Club stage as vehicles are not permitted down the Club Lane. Parking for cars is available at the Harbour Conservancy car park (Pay & Display).

Road Trailers may remain on the staging; however, the staging may flood at high water Spring Tides.

- 1.4 For sailors arriving at the club with a boat on a road trailer, especially at busy times, it is simplest to go straight into the Conservancy Pay and Display Car Park, unhitch and wheel the boat plus sailing kit down Club Lane on to the stage. Road trailers may be left in the car park or on the stage under your dinghy. Cars are not permitted in the club lane.

2. CLUBHOUSE

All competitors and their families are invited to use the facilities of the Club, during their stay. They will be deemed to be Temporary Members for the duration of the event, and as such, shall abide by all the Club's rules and traditions.

3. DRESS

Members and visitors to the club are asked to change from their sailing clothes in the evenings and dress appropriately for the time of day. It is recommended that valuables are not left in the changing rooms. Items of value may be deposited with the Office for safe keeping, at owner's risk.

4. ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation in the Club is available. Please arrange with the Office: 01243 512400.

5. CATERING

Bar and catering facilities will be available for the duration of the event. A supper for sailors and their families is planned for the Saturday evening. Please book for this supper either on the Entry Form or at the club office.
